DID YOU KNOW?

⁹⁸ The words of the song are credited to Edward Mordaunt Spencer and the music to Charles William Glover, but many believe that the song was written by Tralee Poet William Pembroke Mulchinock out of love for Mary O'Connor, a maid who worked in the Mulchinock household.

Dublin-born Alice O'Sullivan, was the first ever Rose of Tralee in 1959. Though she faced adversity, having to leave her airline job because of the marriage ban, Alice returned to college – studying, and then becoming a lecturer in Environmental Psychology, as well as going on to coach skiing to disabled students.

The First Televised Rose Event: The Gala Rose Ball was introduced in the seventies, as was the involvement of Irish Cultural Organisations including Siamsa Tíre, the band of An Garda Siochána and US military bands. Teilifís Éireann first broadcast Rose Selection live in 1967 from a stage outside the Ashe Memorial Hall. Compere for TV was the late Joe Lynch (Dinny from RTÉ TV soap Glenroe). The show also featured a major parade of entertainers in front of the stage. Rose Selection has been compered by Kevin Hilton, Joe Lynch, Terry Wogan, Brendan O'Reilly, Michael Twomey, Gay Byrne, Kathleen Watkins, Derek Davis, Marty Whelan, Ryan Tubridy, Ray D'Arcy and most recently by Dáithí Ó Sé and Kathryn Thomas.

HOW IT ALL STARTED...

An Tóstal was a series of festivals around the country launched in 1953 to celebrate all that was great and good about Irish life. From this concept emerged the inaugural Rose of Tralee Festival (or Festival of Kerry as it was then called) in 1959. Before The Tóstal Festival was phased out in 1958 it gave inspiration to the founders of the Rose of Tralee Festival to create an event that would attract 'Roses' from ex-patriate communities. The idea for the Rose of Tralee International Festival came when a group of local business people met in Harty's bar, Tralee to come up with ideas to bring more tourists to the town during the horse racing meeting and to encourage expats to return to their native Tralee. So it was that the first Rose of Tralee Festival was held in 1959 with Rose representatives from Tralee, London, Dublin, Birmingham, and New York.

Festival map




DISCOVER MORE FAMILY ACTIVITIES IN KERRY


Dunquin

In Dunquin, the most westerly parish on the Dingle Peninsula, is a unique heritage centre and museum. The Blasket Centre tells the story of the Blasket Islands and the tiny Irish speaking community who lived there until the mid-20th century. The Centre is also a stunning piece of architecture in itself.

The complete upgrade of the Centre in 2022, with its totally renewed and interactive exhibitions, provides an imaginative and authentic re-telling of the story of the Blasket islands, their rich heritage and unique literature. The Centre is a Wild Atlantic Way Signature Discovery Point and a highlight of any visit to the Dingle Peninsula. The site incorporates a fully accessible clifftop viewing platform that offers dramatic views of the Blasket archipelago and the Atlantic coastline.

Life on the Blaskets was difficult. People survived by fishing and farming and every day involved a struggle against the elements. Emigration and decline led to the final evacuation of the Great Blasket in 1953.

Visit the Blasket Centre to experience the extraordinary legacy of the Blasket Islanders and delve into the heart of Irish culture, language and history.





The trail begins in the heart of Tralee, the largest town in Kerry, and takes riders on a journey through the picturesque countryside to the charming seaside village of Fenit. Along the way, cyclists will encounter a variety of breathtaking views, including the wild Atlantic Ocean, majestic mountains, and verdant fields.

One of the most striking features of the Tralee Fenit Greenway is the diverse range of landscapes that it covers. The trail begins by crossing the River Lee, which flows through Tralee and out into Tralee Bay. From there, riders are treated to a stunning view of the Dingle Peninsula, with its rugged coastline and rolling hills in the distance.

As the trail approaches Fenit, the scenery becomes even more spectacular, with stunning views of the ocean and the rugged cliffs that line the coast.

Nestled on the rugged coast of County Kerry in southwestern Ireland, the Tralee Fenit Greenway is a 13.6km stretch of off-road trail that winds its way through some of the most stunning landscapes the region has to offer. From quaint villages and tranquil beaches to rugged cliffs and rolling hills, this scenic route has something for everyone, making it a must-see destination for tourists and locals alike.

The Slea Head Drive (Slí Cheann Sléibhe) is a part of the Wild Atlantic Way, beginning and ending in Dingle, and stunning views on the western end of the Dingle Peninsula. The route is clearly labelled by road signs throughout its length. The Slea Head Route when done slowly over allowing time for the many interesting stops and detours along the way. A minimum of a half-day should be set

Travellers are strongly advised to travel clockwise in order to avoid meeting the large tour buses that frequent the route during the summer. Part of the Slea Head cliff road is very narrow and single lane only. The route is suitable for motorists, but is also enjoyed by cyclists - bicycles can be hired at a number of locations in Dingle.

Slea Head Drive, one of Ireland's most scenic routes, takes you on a journey through historic sites, Irish speaking villages, famous Hollywood film locations with close up views of the world renowned Blasket Islands and distant views of the Skellig Islands on the south western horizon.
